Investment Council Secretariat

Structure of the Secretariat

- **Staff:** The IC Secretariat consists of the Head of the Secretariat, an Assistant, a Lawyer and one to two Economists. It has some further resources to conduct special studies/employ short term consultants;

- Backstopping: EBRD's Resident Office (Tirana) and Investment Climate and Governance team (London): Provide strategic guidance in coordination with the Government and other international financial institutions and donors;
